This article will explore my transformative experience during the exchange program at Hokkaido University in Japan. Beginning in my final semester of college, this journey marked a significant period of personal growth and discovery. 中文



- <u> </u>	目的
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Studying abroad has provided me with many opportunities, including the chance to learn a new language. The most effective way to learn a language is to immerse yourself by living among the local people. I'm not sure when I first became interested in learning Japanese, but my motivation to study the language came from my love for Japanese TV shows. This passion led me to choose Japan for my exchange program, specifically at Hokkaido University.

I chose Hokkaido University because of the HUSTEP program, which offers courses for students from diverse backgrounds and provides Japanese language classes. I decided to spend my last semester at Hokkaido University because I wanted to experience a different learning environment and make new friends. Unlike other cities in Japan, such as Tokyo or Osaka, Sapporo—where Hokkaido University is located—offers a much better environment for learning Japanese and studying in general. In big cities like Tokyo, there are many tourists and foreigners, which makes it relatively difficult to practice Japanese.



Below is a timeline outlining the process.

Winter 2021: The idea of participating in an exchange program first emerged. Try to research about it

October 2022: Successfully passed the language proficiency exam and was accepted into Hokkaido University's program.

Spring 2023: National Cheng Kung University (NCKU) announced the available exchange student quotas and the internal selection process for that year.

Spring 2023: Wrote the autobiography, study plan, and other necessary documents.

Summer 2023: Successfully passed the internal selection process at NCKU. Began filling out the application forms for Hokkaido University.

January–February 2024: Received documents from Hokkaido University intermittently, applied for housing, and filled out basic information forms.

March 2024: Received the visa documents from Hokkaido University just a few days before departure and finally obtained the visa.

March 31, 2024: Arrived at Hokkaido University and began the program.

August 23, 2024: Returning to Taiwan

三 研究期間

Before arrival:

Visa:

To exchange in Japan, you need to have a valid residence visa before entering Japan. For the application, you can either go to Japan-Taiwan exchange association office. In Taiwan, there are two offices, which one is in Taipei city, and another is located in Kaohsiung. For a person whom residence is in the North parts of Taiwan, he or she need to go to Taipei office for visa application. As for me, since my residence card address is in Tainan, therefore, I must go to Kaohsiung office for application. The cost of visa applications is 1600 NTD.

For non-Taiwanese citizen required documents are:

- 1. Application forms
- 2. 2-inch picture
- 3. Residence card and a photocopy
- 4. Passport and a photocopy
- 5. Student ID and a photocopy
- 6. Certificate of Enrolment (CoE)
- 7. Flight Tickets

As for residence visa, the CoE will be received from NCKU sent by Hokkaido university. You might have to wait until you received CoE in order to apply for residence visa. In Japan, in case you already stayed in Japan with your visa-free, you have to go out of Japan in order to apply for residence. In Japan, it is not possible to change from visitor visa to residence.

Flight:

For the flight to Sapporo, there are many direct flights from Taoyuan airport to New Chitose airport. For my flight, it is cost me about 18000 NTD, where I have a transits in Tokyo Narita airport.

Immigration:

At the immigration, the officer will be asked you to show him CoE from Hokkaido university. After show he/she the CoE, you will received the residence card at the airport. (在留p-下)

Baggage and clothing:

In Sapporo, the temperature is about -2 to 5 degrees in April. The temperature will be rising until August which is around 20-25 degrees at night and 28-32 degrees during the days. For your convenience, you can buy winter clothing in the Sapporo city. Japanese brands like GU and Uniqlo can be half the price when you buy in Taiwan. I don't recommend to bring much clothes from Taiwan, since you will be ending up buying more clothes during your exchange and might be difficult later when you come back to Taiwan

Calls and Internet card:

You can buy the sim card at the Taiwan airport directly or by booking online through kkday or klook platform, for your first two weeks of your stays in Japan. Alternatively, you can buy travel sim card in electronics store for examples; BIC- camera or Yodobashi.

After arrival:

How to get to the city:

Depend on where your accommodation has been assigned from Hokkaido university. As for myself, I got assigned to Kita 8 international house which located near to Soen station (桑園駅), which it is just a station after Sapporo station if you are coming from New Chitose airport. From New Chitose airport, there are an express JR train directly from the airport to Sapporo station (特 急列車). It is usually cost about 1200 Yen. However, for reserved seat 指定席, will be cost additional 700 Yen. I recommend to get non-reserved seat 自由席.

Money and cash:

You can bring some of the cash to Japan but you have to be careful with the limit of cash bring to Japan. The limits is 1 Millions Yen in cash. For your everyday life you can used VISA and Mastercard for many shops in Japan, however, for JCB card, as shop of the shop does not accept. You can find any ATM in any convenient store which usually charged a handling fees for 100 yen for every 10000 yen of your withdraw.

Necessities:

There are many drug store like Tsuruha or Sapporo drug store located nearby your dormitory. For cooked food, meat and vegetables, there are many supermarkets around Hokkaido university depend on which dorm that you have been assigned to. For example, Aeon mall, Daiichi or superArcs. As for electrical appliances such as Rice cooker or electric fans or hair dryer and so on, I recommend you buy from second hand store or recycling store. For example, 2^{nd} streets or you can type on google maps looking for $\iint \# d \not h \lor \forall \exists \forall \vartheta''$ -literally mean recycling shop. As I got rice cooker for half the price in compared to buying brands new from electronics shop like Yodobashi.

Living costs:

I spend about 150000 yen on average in a month. As 50000 yen is for the rent and 100000 yen included eating out, grocery and extra curricular activities. In case of leaving the town, its might cost more than 150000 yen per month.

Bicycle:

Many of dormitory offers by Hokkaido university is quite far away, there might be because of the Hokkaido university campus is very large. For kita 8 international house, takes 25 minutes' walk to the classroom. In the spring, as snow has already been melted therefore buying a bicycle is a good deals. There is a bicycle shop チャリクルサイクルショップ close to city office北区役所 which offers second hands bicycle at low price as could costs as much as 10000 yen.

四 心得

During my exchange at Hokkaido University, I had the opportunity to meet many new people and experience various cultural differences. Over my five-month stay in Japan, I improved my language skills in both English and Japanese and became better at communicating with others. Whenever I encountered problems, the HUSTEP program staff at Hokkaido University were always helpful. I also noticed that everyone in my classes was actively engaged in group discussions.

One of the highlights of my exchange was participating in the YOSAKOI Festival in Sapporo. Through this festival, I was able to connect with many people from different countries, including local residents.

For those who are worried about studying abroad, whether due to language barriers or concerns about making friends, I want to reassure you. When you arrive at your destination, you won't feel left out. People will be eager to get to know you, your story, and your country, so don't be afraid to take the leap and go on an exchange.
